A Safer Keyham - Operational Delivery Group and Action Plan

Operational Delivery Group (ODG) Objectives

Together, Devon and Cornwall Police, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) and Plymouth City Council will work together to:

- Restore feelings of safety through a range of initiatives including target hardening, high visibility policing, problem solving approaches and extensive community engagement.
- Mitigate future and existing harm through community policing and safer streets style interventions.
- Advance community action through investment in empowerment and skills-based engagement, an enhanced youth provision and citizen consultations to lead to sustainable citizen led change.

Operational Delivery Group (ODG) Functions

- *Manage the deliverables and any grant requirements of the Home Office to time, budget and for maximum benefit for the community of Keyham*
- *Monitor the overall performance of the programme and overcome obstacles, escalating where needed*
- *Unite any respective grants into a single partnership bringing together Devon and Cornwall Police, the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner (OPCC) and Plymouth City Council*
- *Listen and incorporate community feedback via partners, existing groups and day to day delivery to ensure community ownership and input into grant deliverables where appropriate*
- *Act as the central hub for information cascading to all stakeholders on a regular basis*
- *Create sustainable and long-term impacts on behalf of the investment*
- *To provide local and national lessons learnt and an evidence base in how our efforts have supported a community who has experienced a mass shooting.*

Frequency and Membership

The meeting will meet bi-monthly and will be co-chaired by the following **Senior Responsible Officers (SROs)** who will and take collective responsibility for the delivery of the programme:

1. Plymouth City Council – Dave Ryland, Community Connections Strategic Manager
2. Devon and Cornwall Police – Chief Inspector Phil Williams
3. OPCC/ Devon and Cornwall Police – Rebecca Skellett, Programme Director, Serious Violence Prevention

<p>Community Policing</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Total Amount: £514,000 to be granted to the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner - Start Date: At point of grant signing. - End Date: 12 months after signature – (estimated November 2022) <p><i>Support visible police patrols in the Keyham area, with the primary objective of providing community reassurance through a visible policing presence. Patrol routes and locations will be informed by community and partnership engagement, with a view to targeting particular hotspots within Keyham. Visible patrols are expected to enhance feelings of community safety and deter increases in violence and crime.</i></p> <p>Figures quoted remain unconfirmed until such time as the Home Office Issue the grants to the responsible organisation.</p>	<p>Coordination of Police resources throughout the locality to offer a visual community reassurance further target key issues impacting the safety and feeling of safety.</p> <p>Academic/Independent Evaluator – Reviewing the effectiveness of measures.</p> <p>Problem Solving Plan – to enable police and partners to address long term issues effecting the community and the early identification and assessment of emerging risk.</p> <p>Sustained Community Engagement and Consultation – working alongside a healthier Keyham group.</p> <p>Youth Engagement – working with young people to engage them in healthy activity, building an understanding around their needs and working with partners to formulate plans to accommodate.</p> <p>Data Collection and Analysis - to identify local priorities and inform problem solving.</p>
<p>Safer Keyham</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Total Amount: £308,360 to be granted to Plymouth City Council - Start Date: At point of grant signing. - End Date: 31st March 2022 <p><i>Support the provision of physical, situational crime prevention measures such as improved CCTV, environmental improvements and target hardening of properties. The primary objective is to support the local community and prevent crimes from happening in the first place. Interventions are expected to improve feelings of community safety and strengthen Keyham, resulting in increased community ownership, as well as preventing some neighbourhood crimes and anti-social behaviour from taking place or being dispersed from neighbouring areas.</i></p> <p>Figures quoted remain unconfirmed until such time as the Home Office Issue the grants to the responsible organisation.</p>	<p>Street Scheme – infrastructure (CCTV and Lighting) will be continually reviewed in line with the emerging needs of the community. No specified requirements currently however 2 re-deployable CCTV cameras will be purchased through this funding.</p> <p>Community Training – The focus will be to be build the skills and capability for long term community recovery which may include restorative justice, trauma informed and crime prevention training.</p> <p>Environmental visual audit – EVA to be conducted in the area to consider what improvements can be made to enhance the feeling of safety.</p> <p>Feel Safe Scheme – to prevent and address neighborhood crime through the proactive deployment of home security measures.</p> <p>Crime Prevention Outreach – Promote exiting programs in the area to enhance the feeling of safety.</p> <p>Reclaiming Public Spaces – working with the community understand their sense of safety when in public spaces and address where possible through physical works.</p> <p>Youth Engagement – working with young people to engage them in healthy activity, building an understanding around their needs and working with partners to formulate plans to accommodate.</p> <p>Awareness raising of potential harm/Communications – distributing information across the Keyham networks surrounding emerging issues and/or relevant matters to improve the understanding of key individual/communities. Consider training needs and opportunities to facilitate these.</p> <p>Community Sparks Funding - to focus on Keyham & community cohesion/pride projects in the area and the reclaiming of open spaces.</p> <p>Safer Keyham Board – The Community Cohesion Group is currently reviewing all relevant information around the locality and implementing responses where suitable. Consideration to be given in time surrounding the longevity of this group, lead, membership and objectives.</p>
